Courses

Blue 6.6Km, 130m, 26 controls Long, technically difficult with pictorial descriptions

Short Green 3.4Km, 65m, 19 controls Shorter medium distance, technically difficult with pictorial descriptions

Light Green 3.9Km, 70m, 18 controls Medium distance, technically Medium with loose pictorial descriptions, textural descriptions on the map

Red 4.6Km, 80m, 16 controls *Long, technically easy with textural descriptions.*

Inf Teams Harris Team race with teams of 4 runners. Slowest runner time multiplied by 4 is the team time.

Course deltails subject to final controlling

Event Information

Entry Process

To enter yourself, your soldiers or friends and family, you will need to create an account on RaceSingUp; there is a link to event just above this text.

Entries close at Midday on the Tuesday before the event. Entries can't be withdrawn or changed after then. Late entries accepted up to 8pm for an additional £1.

Once you have an account you can enter one or multiple people up to a maximum of 20.

Once someone's details have been entered they can be recalled for future events.

Payment is made at the end of the process with a bank card.

What to expect, what to do

Please make every reasonable effort to arrive at the event in time for your allocated start window, including allowing time to report to Reception.

Please park carefully as there is limited space.

All competitors must ensure they are fully hydrated before starting.

There will be a key drop for your car keys at reception.

Loose control description will be provided at the entrance to the start lanes, EXCEPT for the Red course.

There are no descriptions on the Blue map, they will just be loose.

Refund Policy

You may withdraw from the event up until 12:00hrs the day before. Your entry fee will be held as a credit to be redeemed when you next enter an MLN event. A refund can be made upon request but will incurr the card processing fee

Terrain

This a new map drawn in Apr 25. Mapped area comprises blocks of woodland with good runability, parts of the area have significant remants of mining activity. Much of the area is open moorland with varying runability and many water features. The rough open areas are very rough in places and the tussock grass is deep.

The NW boundary slopes steeply down to the river Swale. There are dangerous crags in this part of the map and courses will be planned to avoid them.
